According to the American Cancer Society, colorectal cancer is the third leading cause of cancer-related deaths in men and women, and the second most common cause of cancer deaths when men and women are combined. It's expected to cause 52,980 deaths during 2021.

Our Medical Policy & Procedure 18 - Standing Orders for Nursing standardizes nursing interventions to improve the health outcomes of our patients. Our support staff can independently offer Immunochemical Fecal Occult Blood Testing (iFOBT) in the past year, flexible sigmoidoscopy in the past 5 years, or colonoscopy in the past 10 years. Alternatively, patients may be offered colonoscopy for colon cancer screening. Referrals are made to the Provider or Team Lead if patients would like to discuss all available options for colon cancer screening.

In addition, our Medical Policy & Procedure 88 - Population-Based Healthcare Management, sets the precedence to improve patient care and health outcomes and to screen for disease that can be prevented, stabilized, or treated early. Colorectal cancer screening (CRCS) will be in accordance with the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) current recommendations for CRCS and CMS 130. Patients \geq 50 to 74 years of age shall have a Fecal Occult Blood Testing (FOBT) once a year or colonoscopy every 10 years.

Waimānalo Health Center runs colorectal cancer screening recalls in January and July each year. Patients shall be recalled if they have not had an FOBT in the past year, or a colonoscopy in the past 10 years.
